## THE MYANMAR POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) ACT,1956.\*

## [Act No. XXVIII OF 1956.] (The 2<sup>nd</sup> October 1956)

It is hereby enacted as follows: ---

- This Act may be called the Myanmar Post Office (Amendment) Act.
   1956.
- 2. In clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Myanmar Post Office Act, hereinafter referred to as the said Act, after the word "Letters" the expression "not more than five in number" shall be inserted.
- 3. In section 58 of the said Act, after sub-section (2) thereof, the following shall be inserted as sub-section (3), namely:—
  - "(3) In any prosecution under clause (d) of sub-section (1) it may be presumed unless and until the contrary is proved, that if more than five letters excepted under clause (e) of sub-section (1) of section 4 are sent by a private friend in his way, journey or travel, possession of them amounts to making a collection of letters."
